Our After School Clubs will be re-starting the first week back after half term – w.c. 19th February 2024. A full list will be published next week along with details of how to book. Thank you.








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Writing Competition








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World Book Day and School Book Fayre

FS2 and Year 6 Height and Weight Measurement

Every year, the National Child Measurement Programme (nursing team) come into school and do height and weight measurement checks for all pupils in FS2 and year 6. The measurements are used to calculate weight status, e.g. overweight, healthy weight or underweight. They collect this information as part of an ongoing national programme to collect trends. Children are measured fully clothed, except for their coats and shoes, in a private space away from other pupils. The wellbeing of children and families is very important to us and measurements are conducted in a compassionate way, in private and away from other children.

The nursing team will be in school on the following dates to do the children's height and weight checks.

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

Saturday 10th February, Rotherham College Talks, workshops and advice from music industry professionals




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Sound of Rotherham

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PARTICLE SHRINE



10th – 29th February, Magna Science Adventure Centre An immersive sound sculpture that makes invisible forces, visible.

Invisible messengers from deep in the universe surround us. These messengers are known as cosmic rays, and billions shower Earth every second. They are passing through you at this very moment – blazing close to the speed of light, blasted from supernovae far beyond our galaxy.

Utilising new creative technologies, Particle Shrine transforms this neverending stream of cosmic energy into an immersive, multi-sensory installation featuring musical compositions, vibrating surfaces, shimmering projections and stunning lighting designs. It is a tiny capsule of the cosmos that's unique each time you step inside.

Particle Shrine will be installed in Magna's stunning Face of Steel venue during Signals Festival.

Public entry: everyone is welcome to visit Particle Shrine from 10am – 4pm from Saturday 10th to Sunday 18th February, for free!


